AHC33816 Certificate III in Permaculture Course

All accredited permaculture training is competency based. i.e. when you are competent in a certain area you can be assessed. This may vary in time and energy according to previously-acquired skills. The learning emphasis is on practical work – building, gardening, designing, planning, organising and managing, but there is also a component of knowledge-based skills which need to be understood.

Permaculture Educators Alliance Pty Ltd, in partnership with Skills Strategies International, offers Certificate III in Permaculture and other Accredited Permaculture Training courses. Students engage in both collaborative and individual projects, workshops and skills training exercises. Through the application of permaculture principles and practices our focus is on creating permaculture practitioners who are capable of meeting the sustainability challenges of peak oil, food sovereignty and climate change.

About the Course

This course is undertaken on a part-time basis, one weekend workshop a month over the course of the year. There are about 12 training weekends, and occasional online meetings via Zoom to meet course requirements. Training occurs at locations all over the Perth metro and hills area, with excursions and field trips to various properties, including at least one overnight stay in the wheatbelt. This course is delivered by a teaching team of Martina Hoeppner and Fiona Blackham.

AHC33186 Certificate III in Permaculture

Ideally suited to those who have completed a Permaculture Design Course (PDC) and want to learn more skills and then go out and practice. There are fifteen units (listed below), and topics include soil testing and building, organic pest control, organic gardens and orchards, understanding weather, building structures, plant and animal systems, maps and drawings, and urban and rural design.
